Medication Agreement

Here at Restoration Health, we believe in a comprehensive team approach to treating your musculoskeletal condition. Sometimes this well-rounded treatment plan will involve prescribing medications. Some of these may be opioid, "narcotics" or other controlled substances for a prescribed amount of time. In light of this, please read the following agreement and sign as an indication that you understand and will abide by these policies.

1. All patients receiving medications prescribed by Restoration Health must take their medicines as prescribed. *Please make note of the duration of the prescription (Typically 30 days).
2. You are to be responsible for your medications. No excuses will be accepted by the doctors or nursing team such as "medications were lost, stolen, dropped in the sink, left in a hotel etc." This means no refills will be made before the allotted time for the prescription.
3. We believe that CHRONIC PAIN IS NEVER AN EMERGENCY. No medication refills will be made after office hours, on Fridays, during the weekends or holidays. You must be responsible for managing your medications and making an appointment for a refill of your pain medication before that prescription runs out.
4. No refills or medication changes will be allowed at scheduled procedures or other treatments (i.e. injections/blocks at RH or the outpatient surgery centers.)
5. Patients complaining of new pain, side effects of medications or treatment are encouraged to call the clinic during regular office hours- 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM.
6. You are responsible for informing us of all narcotics prescribed by other physicians outside of our practice, even those for dental and other non-medical procedures.
7. The physicians at Restoration Health prescribe narcotic and opioid medications in a responsible manner. We are concerned about prescribing these medications to persons who, unbeknownst to us, are getting narcotic medications or other medications with addictive potential from other physicians, "off the street", or from a family member. Therefore, ALL patients on narcotic or opioid medications prescribed by Restoration Health physicians agree to unscheduled drug testing and/ or pill counts if the physician deems it necessary. It is illegal in the state of Alabama to "doctor shop". House Bill 152, makes it a Class A misdemeanor to get a prescription by deceptively concealing from a doctor a similar prescription from another doctor for the same period. Offenders could receive up to a year in jail. On a fourth offense within a five-year period, the crime is a Class C felony, which can result in up to 10 years in prison.
8. If you are on chronic narcotic medications, you must understand that Restoration Health physicians will allow you to go through narcotic withdrawal from your medication if we feel that you are using these medications irresponsibly.
9. Failure to abide by this understanding will be taken by the physician/clinic to mean that you either no longer want to be treated by the clinic or that you will not abide by the rules of the clinic and this agreement. In either case, failure to abide might be cause for referral back to your referring physician for care, or to a pain medicine/addiction specialist. Failure to abide by this agreement will put you at risk of dismissal from the clinic
10. Medication refills must be called in to the office FIVE days prior to needing refill.
